US YOUTH SOCCER

- ▶ Development focused training
- ▶ Curriculum based
- ▶ **Coaches are licensed** and background checked. (on pathway to improve licensing one level up)
- ▶ Coaching is methodological – focus on education
- ▶ Players have access to varied coaches throughout their Azzurri career enabling a richness in experience
- ▶ Year – long classroom environment for college pathway preparations and development (high school students)
- ▶ New: Feedback system will be documented and regularly shared

LEAGUE SUCCESS

- ▶ The alphabet soup of youth soccer can be confusing. We believe it is important to be in the right league, but the the highest competition league is not always the right place for our players.
- ▶ Azzurri Storm leadership is always looking for the **highest level of competition that best suits our player base.**
- ▶ While other clubs talk about being part of a specific league as a reason for being, it is important to look at their performance overall in that league.
- ▶ We believe in personal development and team development together as being important to player growth.
- ▶ *Winning is not always an indicator of success.*
- ▶ Azzurri Storm is committed to supporting the individual goals of each player and working to challenge them in their current environment.

COMMITMENT FOR U13+

Time


- **3 practices** a week (1.5 hours) Premier Teams
- 2 practices a week (1.5 hours) Purple/White Teams
- Extra **homework** for players to do at home based on coaching standards
- **League Games** – Miami and locations south of Orlando
- **4 Tournaments per season** (includes 3-4 games in a weekend and travel potential)
- Additional team meetings and parent-player education events
- **High School season** – teams do not practice or play games generally

Expectations

- **Training is mandatory.** Not attending will have implications in game minutes.
- **Financial Commitment** is necessary for team fees and failure to contribute to the team fees will have implication in ability to attend games.
- **Game attendance** is not optional. The games are part of the learning experience and the commitment to the program is inclusive of the game commitment.
- Show up **on time** for training and games
- **Communicate any issues** with coaches before events and use Team Snap to provide RSVPs
- **Ref Abuse** is not tolerated from players and parents

FINANCIAL COMMITMENT

\$3,900 annual expense estimate



- **Registration costs** for the club: **\$1900**
- **Uniform costs** (lasts 2 years): **\$500**
- **Team costs: \$500** average a year
 - coaching travel costs
 - VEO (camera subscription)
 - Tournament fees (and ref costs)
- **Personal Travel** cost: **varies**
 - estimate 4 nights for hotel stays + gas + food (assume 2 away tournaments in Florida)
 - *Older teams:* assume more significant travel based on tournament/showcase schedules
 - *Older teams:* players can travel without family to reduce costs

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN RECREATIONAL AND COMPETITIVE SOCCER?

Recreational

- Teams are assigned without skill-based assessment
- Players do not try out to play
- Playing time is balanced on a team
- Practice is 1 a week
- Games on Saturday only
- Coaches are volunteers; do not hold licenses
- No development assessment
- Season is 2+ months each (Fall / Spring)

Competitive

- Teams are assigned based on player tryouts
- Players must try out, and an offer is not guaranteed
- Playing time standards are not consistent; 50% minimum for players U8 – U12 while U13+ is based on various factors
- Practice 2-3 times a week
- Games on Saturday and Sunday
- Includes tournaments weekends
- Coach is licensed
- Player development assessments
- Season is 9 months – follows school year calendar (CCPS)
- Access to additional training

THE TRYOUT PROCESS

Logistics

- Each spring, clubs hold tryouts – end of April - May
- Players must be registered to tryout
- Players will receive a t-shirt to bring to the tryout events
- 2-3 tryout events are required to attend
- Coaches for the upcoming season make decisions
- Coaches will call or email parents with a decision starting the night of the first tryout up to the end of the tryout season.
- All parents will receive a call or email no matter the decision.
- **If a roster spot is provided, 48 hours to register and pay deposit fee \$100.**
- We recommend not to discuss offers with others during this process.

Player Process

- Players will **wear their Azzurri Storm tryout shirt**
- When signing in at the table, they player will receive their **number to pin to their shorts.**
- Keep this number for the entire process.
- Players will be asked to work in small groups and be assessed on **technical skills.**
- Players will scrimmage
- Players will be assessed on their **soccer IQ** during scrimmaging and small group training sessions
- Coaches evaluate development levels
- Coaches will determine the Premier Team (1st) then evaluate the Purple teams (2nd)

THE TRYOUT PROCESS

- ▶ All teams in a specific age and gender (U10 boys, for instance) hold tryouts together.
- ▶ The coaches for that age group work together to identify the best team/fit for the players.
- ▶ The first team (Premier Coach) will reach out first and fill their squad.
- ▶ The next team (Purple or White) will then be able to make their choices and contact those players and so on.
- ▶ It may take a few days to hear from a coach- do not despair if there is not a phone call the night that the last tryouts take place!
- ▶ Every player will be contacted, regardless of the outcome.
- ▶ Once an offer is made it is imperative that you either **accept or decline the offer and register within 48 hours** in order for the coaches to be able to move forward with creating their teams

NEXT STEPS

- ▶ Tryouts and ID Sessions end Thursday (April 24th)
- ▶ Premier coaches will reach out to players first
- ▶ Purple coaches will wait until offers for Premier teams are completed
- ▶ 48 hours to make a decision
- ▶ If yes, pay a \$100 registration fee
- ▶ Season Fees will begin May 1st (chosed to pay upfront or monthly)
- ▶ After registration, any fees collected will not be refunded if player decision changes
- ▶ Summer Training will begin in mid July
- ▶ Season officially begins in August
- ▶ Uniform kit ordering information will be sent out in May and should be ordered by June 15th
- ▶ Games will begin in August
